## A GUIDE TO THE MYSTERY

---

*At Mass, heaven and earth meet.*

**T**HE LORD Jesus Christ, risen from the dead on Easter morning, draws near to His people. He gathers us into one place, speaks to us through His Word, feeds us with His life, and sends us back into the world renewed. The Mass is not just something we attend. It is a living encounter with the Risen Lord, a glimpse of the new life He won for us through His sacrifice and Resurrection.



**THE GATHERING** We come together as one family before the Lord. We bring our joys and burdens, our gratitude and our failures, and place them before His mercy. In this first movement of the Mass, we remember that we belong to Him, and that He is already at work among us.

**THE WORD** In the Scriptures, the Lord speaks to His people. The Mass is filled with His Word, and more than that, the whole Mass is shaped by it. Here, the Word of the Lord is not only read. It is heard, answered, prayed, and made present in the life of the Church. We are gathered into a story much larger than our own, and invited to hear the Lord anew.

**THE EUCHARIST** At the heart of the Mass, the Lord gives us a gift beyond words. Through the words of Christ and the invocation of the Holy Spirit, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. In this mystery, the Lord feeds His people and unites the Word and the Eucharist as one act of sacrifice. The table before us is at once the table of the Word and the table of His Body.

**THE MISSION** Mass does not end with the final blessing. The same Lord we encounter here goes with us into our homes, our work, and our daily lives, calling us to carry His light, His peace, and His love to others.

## FROM THE PASTOR

---

**E**VEN THOUGH I rarely hike, or bike, or ski, or kayak, I still *love* living in the Pacific Northwest. View for view on a daily basis, I am not sure there is anywhere more beautiful in the world.

But I also love it because living here allows me to *viscerally* connect with the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord. At the beginning of Lent, we are still deep into the cold, dark, gray, rainy season. In fact, we are six months into it, and our souls are ground down by so many months of oppression. I find I am always less energetic and mildly depressed around the time of Ash Wednesday, and entering into Lent is extremely difficult because I am not sure what else can be wrung out of the dry stone of my life. This is a profound analogy for sin and the way it slowly eats away at us until we are shells of our former selves.

Then, the closer and closer we get to Easter, the more the beauty of our natural Eden shows forth. The cherry buds blossom, we begin to have days so clear that you can see the mountains all the way up in Canada, and things begin to feel hopeful again. I can think of fewer experiences more like emerging from the tomb of death into eternal life. Living here most of my life, I cannot separate PNW Spring from Easter, and I am thankful for it: I can *feel, in my bones* the joy and exultation of the Resurrection of our Lord.

Of course, there is overlap. In my ideal world, we would have unending rain right up through Good Friday, and then nothing but sun for the 50 days of Easter. That never happens. We start to see glimpses of Spring even during Passiontide, and locals know the rain does not disappear until at least July 05. And yet, that is the reality of life this side of the Resurrection: Even though Jesus has conquered death, we still experience the effects of sin and death in our lives; and even when we sin, the light of God pushes through. And yet, we know and believe that the Resurrection is as inevitable as the changing of the seasons, and praise God for that!

I hope you and your families have an incredible Easter. There is nothing more majestic than our salvation through Jesus Christ.
